(Please) Let it snow, let it snow, let it snow! "How Bad Is It?"

In a word, it's bad. At the end of January, the snow cover across the Western US was the lowest in the MODIS satellite record dating back to 2001 with many sites at less than 50% of historical averages. In Silverton, the total season snowfall of just over 30" is the lowest amount recorded since the first year of the Hardrock 100 (91-92 snow season). Silverton typically has 90" of snowfall at the end of January. For reference, the only time the run was cancelled due to fire danger (due to the Missionary Ridge Fire near Durango) was in 2002 when the total snowfall in Silverton at the end of January was 48" (vs 30" this year). Since "hope dies last" we can look back in the historical record for some solace: the second-lowest snowfall total on Feb 1 was in 2000 but heavy snows in March and April (120" !) brought the total up to near normal. Typically, Silverton sees 40" of snowfall in March. So, all eyes are on the possible breakdown of the current La Nina pattern. And yes, there are some signs that the current weather pattern will change by the end of February. There is still hope for a "March Miracle" in the San Juans!
